

## Newsletter

We have once again reduced crime significantly this month. We have recorded 208 crimes committed in the South area in July a reduction of 39 crimes which is outstanding considering the challenges the team face at this busy time of year.

In July 2010 we have recorded the following crime categories and the reductions are again excellent. Serious and Acquisitive crime is down 40.7%. Burglary is down 37.8%. Violent crime is down 19.1%. Vehicle crime is down 44.7%. Again really strong evidence that what we are doing is working and all our community engagement in the South area is paying dividends as ASB has been reduced again this month by 5.5%. Again considering the increase in asb due to the school holidays we have done really well to maintain and reduce our asb. The excellent work my team and our partners are doing with the youth of the area is making a massive difference.

We have had an ongoing problem with shoplifting and for the fourth month we have seen dramatic results. We have again reduced shoplifting in July by 50%. A real success and thank you to all our shops for assisting us to deal with this issue.

The area has seen an increase in pedal cycle thefts. These crimes are purely opportunistic. The school holidays play a big part as children are out on their bikes and leave them outside shops, houses and in park areas without securing them. Please ensure that if you or your children have pedal cycles please secure them and lock them away at night as we have had some sheds broken into.

Please see the below advert for VPX my PCSOs have worked extremely hard once again to get this massive event up and running and it will be an amazing chance throughout the summer for everyone to enjoy. This is another fantastic enhancement to our youth provision in South area. The first event went well with over 500 children attending enjoying the day's free activities.

I am very pleased to have secured 2 more new Police Officers to the NPU. Over the past 12 months I have been Policing the area with 13 Police Officers. From September 6<sup>th</sup> we will have 2 officers joining us who are transferring from other areas. This will take us to full staffing on both Police Officers and PCSOs.

Creamfields Festival is happening over the August Bank Holiday period 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. I have worked with the community to put in place a robust strategy to Police the community. Thank you to all the community representatives that have contributed to this plan to ensure we do everything we can to minimise the impact of the event on our local communities. The community should see an increased number of Officers in our area.

## Crime Prevention

### **GARDEN TIPS:**

Ensure that your garden's fence, walls and gates are in a good state of repair. Install outside lighting – low energy dusk to dawn lighting is recommended. Keep trees and shrubs trimmed so that thieves cannot use them as a screen to work behind – consider planting 'prickly' plants to act as a visual deterrent as well as a physical barrier. If you have a garden shed it is important that it is in a good condition, is fitted with a suitable lock and any windows are secured – remember to keep the shed locked!

### **Satellite Navigation Systems (Sat Nav)**

These are the main target for thieves at this time. You are advised to remove these from your vehicle completely when not in use. If you still wish to keep your Sat Nav in your vehicle but out of sight ensure that it is switched off. There are ways of detecting a Sat Nav system that is hidden in a vehicle if it is left switched on. Register your Sat Nav system [www.immobilise.com](http://www.immobilise.com)

### **Mobile Phone Theft**

Please help us to reduce mobile phone crime. Register your Mobile Phone for free at; [www.immobilise.com](http://www.immobilise.com) Once you have registered your phone, you will have a better chance of getting it back if it has been lost or stolen. (Cheshire Police check any recovered phones against this database).

If your phone is lost or stolen, report it to your network operator as soon as possible. To find the right number for your network, call the Immobilise Information Line on 08701 123 123. Reporting your phone as lost or stolen will enable immobilise to block both your SIM card and your handset.

## Burglary

**Make your home more secure and make it difficult for the burglar. Most burglaries are committed by opportunist thieves and in many cases they don't even have to use force - they get in through an open door or window. Look at your home through the burglar's eyes and take a few steps to prevent yourself from becoming a victim of crime:**

**Windows** - make sure all your downstairs and easily accessible upstairs windows have key operated locks fitted - and use them (particularly when going out). Even small windows, such as bathroom fan lights are vulnerable - a thief can get through any gap larger than a human head!

**Secure all doors** - if your front and back doors are not secure, then neither is your home!

Make sure the doors and frames are strong and in good condition. Fit back and front doors with a five-lever mortise deadlock - and use it! Fit all exterior doors - top and bottom - with bolts (modern UPVC doors normally have a multi-point locking system anyway)

**Lighting** - Good external lighting (either PIR or Dusk to Dawn) can deter a thief.

**Look in when you are out** - use timer switches to turn on lights, radios (on a talking station) and other appliances when you are out. It is more welcoming anyway, if you are entering the house alone.

If you are going away over the holiday, get a friend or neighbour to look after your house - collect post, draw curtains etc. And you are prepared to do the same.

**Garages and Sheds** - Often full of expensive tools and bikes - Fit garage and shed doors with a strong padlock and make sure they are solid enough not to be kicked in. Consider using an audible shed alarm.

**Gates and Fences** - Check for weak spots where a thief could get in - broken fencing or back gate with a weak/no lock. Thorny hedges around the perimeter are a good deterrent, but make sure the front of your house is visible to passers-by so that a burglar cannot work unseen.

**Postcode your property** - Marked property can deter burglars because it is harder to sell and can help the police to return it if it is found. Visible marking is best, but UV pens can be used if this is not suitable. Record serial numbers of goods and take photographs of valuable items such as jewellery etc.

**Keep valuable items out of sight** - don't leave items on display - what a temptation for a thief! Do not leave the boxes from the new equipment you have just bought outside your home.

**Insurance** - Are you fully insured? Insurance can relieve you of the financial worry of replacing stolen goods and many companies will offer reduced premiums for people with good security and those in a **Homewatch Scheme**.

## Homewatch

### Pedal Cycle Thefts

Cyclists in Warrington are being urged to lock up their bikes after a spate of thefts.

A number of bicycles have been stolen in the Warrington South area over the past few weeks and residents are being urged to remain vigilant.

In some of the incidents bicycles have been stolen from outside shops and other buildings - with Latchford being a current hotspot area for this type of crime.

Police are encouraging anyone who owns a bike to reassess their current security to reduce their chance of falling foul of thieves.

Police Community Support Officer James Butterworth, of [Warrington South Neighbourhood Policing Unit](#), said: “We are urging anyone who owns a bicycle to be on their guard while out and about. It is easy to get distracted and forget to do the little things but people need to ensure their bike is secure before they leave it unattended.

“We would urge cyclists to invest in a good quality bike lock for whenever they are out and about and their bike is left unattended - even for a short period of time.

“Never be tempted to prop your bike up against a wall while you nip into a shop - it only takes a minute for a thief to steal it.

“We would also encourage cyclists not to attach their bicycle to something which could easily be moved or cut and try to leave it in a well-lit area where there are a lot of people around.”

Security for your bicycle when it is at home is also important.

#### ***Top tips to secure your cycle***

- Store any bicycles in a garage, shed or outbuilding.
- Keep any garages, sheds or outbuildings locked and secure - whatever time of the day or night.
- Ensure you use a good quality padlock or other security device - ideally one that will be difficult to force open or cut through.
- Consider securing any large/bulky items like bikes to the inside of the garage, shed or outbuilding - or consider using ground mounted anchoring systems, which lock items to the floor making them difficult to steal.
- Residents are also encouraged to security mark their bicycle - this shows that the item belongs to them and if it is ever stolen and recovered it will be easier for it to be returned to their rightful owner.

PCSO Butterworth added: “Many bicycle thefts are opportunistic - if a thief sees a bicycle that has been left insecure then they are more likely to try to take it. We are doing all we can to reduce the number of incidents of bike theft in the area but we also need the continued support of residents to ensure that we make life more difficult for these types of criminals.

“We are urging anyone who may have witnessed any of these recent incidents of bike theft or has any information, which could assist with our enquiries, to get in touch. We are also urging local residents to report any suspicious activity to police immediately.”

Officers from [Warrington South Neighbourhood Policing Unit](#) are holding a 'meet and greet' event at three key locations in the area on Friday August 6th.

Local officers will be at the Davies Way car park in Lymm between 9am and 11am, the car park of the Springbrook pub in Grappenhall between 11am and 1pm and in the car park of Morrisons in Stockton Heath between 1pm and 3pm.

They will be on hand to chat to members of the public - and to offer any advice or support if needed.

PC Steve Martin, of Warrington South NPU, said: "This is the ideal opportunity for members of the local community to come along and meet their local neighbourhood officers face-to-face. The neighborhood policing team will be on hand throughout the day to offer any advice or support and residents can talk to them in an informal setting and discuss any issues or concerns they might have.

"We have chosen three key locations in the Warrington South area that we know will be busy with people throughout the day. We would encourage as many people as possible to turn up - we want to ensure that this special community engagement event is a success."

The event is being supported by the [Warrington Partnership](#). Representatives from [Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service](#) will also be on hand throughout the day to offer home safety awareness to members of the public. Officials from Trading Standards will also be on hand to offer advice and support on a variety of issues including bogus callers.

#### Latchford & Westy

#### ***You Said, We Did***

- **30th July - Anti-social behaviour**

**You said:** Anti Social Behaviour in Bridgewater Avenue, Cumberland Street, Mersey Walk between 6pm and 10pm.

**We did:** We have patrolled the area of Bridgewater Avenue , Brook Avenue, Mersey Walk and surrounding rounds consistently throughout the month of July. There have been two reports of mini-moto's/unroadworthy bikes in the area during this time, although they have evaded our patrols. Any information that can help us catch those responsible would be appreciated. Cumberland Street and surrounding area have had no reports of off roadbikes. Youths who have made there way over from the Fair on Victoria Park were dealt with firmly, over 24 units of alcohol seized and poured away.

- **Anti-social behaviour and drugs**

**You said:** Anti Social Behaviour and Drugs Victoria Park, Latchford between the hours of 5pm and 11pm.

**We did:** Regular patrols of the Park with officers opening the security gates to be able to respond more quickly to youths who have previously had an advantage due to the openness and easy access. We can still do more with your help to identify those responsible for ASB. Please call crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111 Officers have also conducted speed enforcement outside Victoria Park with a total of 9 vehicles doing in excess of 30 mph over a two hour period. The top speed was 52Mph by a local resident. In partnership with Cheshire Fire Service, a Driver Engagement day was held on the 27th July with 25 persons advised in total for the use of mobile phones and no seat belts. 10 of those advised were local residents. Rampworx is due to take place in August 3rd, 10th, 17th and 24th. Please come along.

- **Anti-social behaviour**

**You said:** During the month, out of Community Feedback, Anti-Social Behaviour on or near to School grounds Alderman & Bolton, St Augustines Schools was increasing.

**We did:** Working with the schools we are contacting parents of those kids and youths who have been using the sites and causing damage whether intentional or not. We are working with the parents to educate the children and youths to respect the sites and not abuse them.

## Stockton Heath , Appleton , Stretton , Hatton & Walton

### **You Said, We Did**

- **31st July - Speeding**

**You said:** Speeding in Fairfield Road Stockton Heath between the hours of 7am until 9am and 4pm until 6pm (commuting times)

**We did:** In July we have completed 3 1/2 hours of enforcement and caught 9 offenders. We have been liaising with the council to promote measures on the road to make it a safer place. We have issued all 9 offenders with tickets. We have placed the speed warning sign along the road during the month to advise motorists of their speed. This month we have conducted more speed checks than last month and have had no increase of offenders caught. This suggests that less drivers are now speeding in on this road.

- **Anti-social behaviour**

**You said:** Target anti-social behaviour and youth drinking alcohol in the Bridge Lane area of the Cobbs estate and Appleton area evenings and weekends between the hours of 3pm and 9pm

**We did:** We have patrolled the Bridge lane area consistently in July and engaged the young people. Last year we canvassed the young people in the area and they told us they wanted a youth club on the Cobbs estate. We have been working hard to set this up with the youth service and we have now got a youth provision. This has unfortunately been delayed and will hopefully be starting in the next 2 weeks at St Mary Magdalene's church hall. This will run weekly every Tuesday evening and will be staffed by Youth services and my PCSOs. We are confident that this will further reduce ASB in the area and reassure the community. This will also compliment Broomfields Youth Project which is on Friday evenings at the leisure centre. During June we have not needed to seize any units of Alcohol. This success in the last 2 months has indicated that ASB and alcohol fuelled incidents are now at a very low level. There have been no reports of anti social behaviour during July on the Cobbs estate and ASB for the whole of the Appleton area is down 25%.

- **Anti-social behaviour**

**You said:** Target anti-social behaviour and youth drinking alcohol in the Walton Gardens area of Walton during evenings and weekends between the hours of 2pm and 11pm

**We did:** We have held multi agency meetings with representatives at the Walton Hall Gardens to target the specific local issues. Since this meeting we have conducted daily high visibility patrols within the gardens specifically targeting the times indicated. The effectiveness is being gauged at the local Walton parish council meetings. During July we have received just one call originating from the Walton hall golf club.

## Lymm Grappenhall and Thelwall

### ***You Said, We Did***

- **2nd August 2010 - Anti-social behaviour**

**You said:** Anti Social Behaviour in the local parks and open spaces. Including Ridgway Grundy Park Heatley Mere and Sow Brook between 5pm –midnight.

**We did:** We have patrolled the above areas for the month of July, specifically at times of concern: Evenings and weekends in particular. In the above locations we have had reported 2 incidents 1 on Sow Brook the 1st of July youths acting in an anti social manner. Officers attended and obtained details, also several seizures of alcohol were made. The 25th of July on Heatley Mere again youths being rowdy. Spoken to and advised no alcohol present on this occasion. No incidents highlighted for Ridgway Grundy Park. A very low level of incidents for the month and has proved the worth of extra attention that we have devoted to the problem, we will continue to do the same especially now that school holidays are upon us. We attended a meeting of Heatley mere residents on the 12th of July as part of engaging the Community and their concerns and will address issues raised. Promoted at the meeting was a Homewatch scheme, which was met with a favorable response and 5 persons have come forward to offer to be co-ordinators.

- **Burglary**

**You said:** Burglary concentrating on car and key offences throughout Lymm between hours of 7pm – 2am.

**We did:** We have had 3 burglaries in dwellings reported for the month and 1 attempt. We have utilised our Proactive Policing Team to concentrate on our area to try and curb these offences. This is a worrying trend and a number of active enquiries are ongoing. They appear to be opportunist and I would reiterate to residents to ensure your property is secure, especially at night and that car keys are not left on view. Also any suspicious activity that you may witness please report via our usual contact methods or crimestoppers. Tel no 0800 555 111.

- **Anti-social behaviour**

**You said:** Anti-social behaviour by nuisance youths in local park areas, in particular Elizabeth Park, Euclid Park and Morris Brook parks between 5pm and midnight.

**We did:** There have only been 6 Anti Social Behaviour incidents for the month in Thelwall and Grappenhall. 1 of which was on Euclid Park on the 17th of July. The substance of, was a group of youths intimidating passers by. A patrol attended and several youths spoken to and cleared from the park. There have been no other incidents. We have had no incidents for Portola Close or Elizabeth Park. We will continue to target the same throughout the summer months. This is a particular low figure for the whole month and we will endeavour to maintain this reduction.

## Community Engagement Update

### Broomfields Youth Project Update.



Since October 2009 Broomfield's Youth Project has gone from strength to strength. Set up to address the Anti Social Behaviour Issues in the South area. The Project is managed by Bridgewater Churches Together who had previously worked at Alexandra Park in Stockton Heath on Friday evenings to engage young people. They have a double decker bus which eventually moved to Broomfield's Leisure Centre in Appleton. The Project started with small numbers of youths playing football on the pitches and has over the past 6 months developed significantly. We now have upto 130 young people from 12 to 17 years of age playing football, swimming and using the dance studio. The Youth bus has laptop computers with internet access and there is a cafe on board.

The partners involved are Cheshire Police, Bridgewater Churches Together, Youth For Christ, Warrington Borough Council and Bridgewater High School. The Project is growing all the time and there is evidence to show that crime and Anti social behaviour has dropped significantly in the South area since the Project began. Alexandra park now have a residents group set up and have very few issues. The park has just been awarded Green Flag status and the community are very confident that the issues have been resolved.

## Rampworx update summer 2010

V.P.X (Victoria Park Experience) has taken over from the past two years when PCSO Tony Spruce and Tom Ried have organised Rampworx coaching on Victoria Park. This year we have extended the event to include more activities that are sustainable rather than being one off summer events. The idea is to include local clubs to provide coaching giving the people who attend the opportunity to get involved on a more permanent basis; we also wanted to give people the opportunity to try activities that they normally wouldn't go to Victoria Park to try.

We have involved many partner agencies including A.S.E.T, I.Y.S.S (part of youth services) Cheshire Fire, W.B.C, Warrington Town F.C and Latchford Albion.

We have secured funding from loads of places including N.A.T, Stronger Together, Cheshire Fire, Latchford West Community Forum, Asda, Co-op, Jewson, and Golden Gates Housing.

V.P.X will be held on Victoria Park between 10 am and 3 pm on Tuesdays 3rd, 10th, 17th and 24th and is open to people of any age and all activities are free.

Activities include Rampworx coaching (for bikes, skateboards and skates), graffiti workshop, football, rugby, bowels, DJ, street dance, ultimate frisbee and a 50' inflatable fire engine assault course. We are also hoping the army will be attending with either a climbing wall or zip wire.

**0845 458 0000** this is the main number for Cheshire Police and is staffed 24/7 to report incidents where something has happened but is not an emergency - an example you found some damage to your property and are perhaps unsure of when it occurred.

**0845 458 6372** - this is the Warrington South Neighbourhood Policing Team number and is a voicemail. If you leave any messages they are answered daily but may not be dealt with that day due to the work patterns. We will get back to you if you leave your name and contact address/phone number. An example of use for this number is for you to ask for a visit, advice, reporting matters of concern etc.
